For Marguerite, discovering psychology at CEGEP was a true revelation that became a genuine passion. "It didn't even feel like work. I just wanted to take as many courses as I could!" she said. Despite all the challenges involved in pursuing a PhD, Marguerite has transformed her personal challenges, like her time in foster care and her ADHD diagnosis, into a quiet resolve to succeed in the field she adores.

Her journey towards independence began when she was 18, and it's a testament to her exceptional maturity. On top of paying her own way, Marguerite generously welcomed her younger sister into her home to support her mental health. Marguerite recognized that her situation would need to change, so she decided to extend her studies to balance work, volunteering and academic success.

"It's absolutely worth it for me, because the thing that really matters is where I'm headed. I feel lucky to have found a field that gives me so much inspiration." Desjardins Foundation scholarships are a key resource for Marguerite, who says she's "prepared to make sacrifices" to pursue her passion.

Javier Armando Porrás-Gil: Engaging in social change

Javier is currently studying civil law at the University of Ottawa. His biggest inspiration is his mother, who overcame many challenges to go back to school. "I want to follow the path she paved for me," he said.

For Javier, engagement means being an active member of society. His experience as a physiotherapy student working with Indigenous communities in the North was a real game changer for him. "Going up north and working with Indigenous peoples as a physiotherapy student opened my eyes to all the challenges they face," he said. "It put me on the path towards law." Javier's scholarship is making a big difference for him. "It allows me to continue my studies and use my knowledge about healthcare to make a difference in the world."

DESJARDINS FOUNDATION PRIZES

A helping hand to create unforgettable moments

Teachers are brimming with ideas for initiatives designed to create meaningful experiences for their students. The Desjardins Foundation Prizes offer a helping hand that can make a big difference by providing up to \$3,000 for projects with kindergarten, elementary or high school students. In 2025, the prizes supported 848 projects, giving nearly 194,000 students experiences that will inspire them to stay in school.

École Wilfrid-Léger, Waterloo, QC

"A project like this is a real source of pride."

At Wilfrid-Léger high school in Waterloo, one teacher's keen insight transformed the day-to-day lives of students with additional support needs. Teacher Marie Lapchuk-Dubé saw the strong appeal of the school's skatepark but noticed that only one of her students had their own skateboard. It dawned on her that she could get the students to build their own skateboards from scratch.

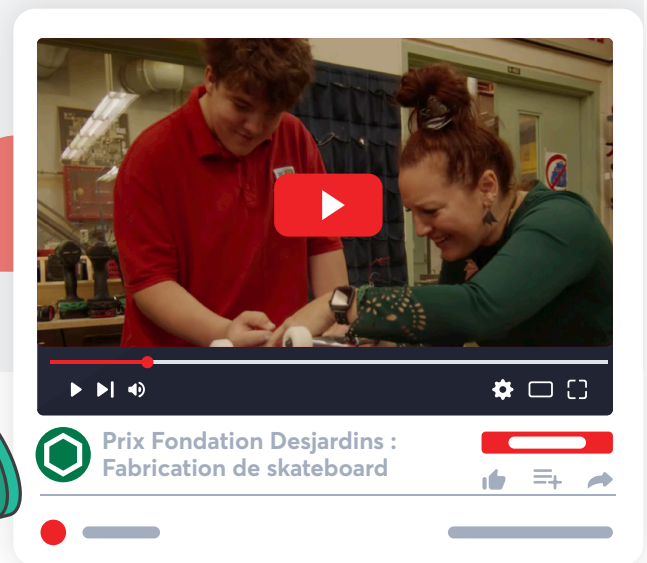
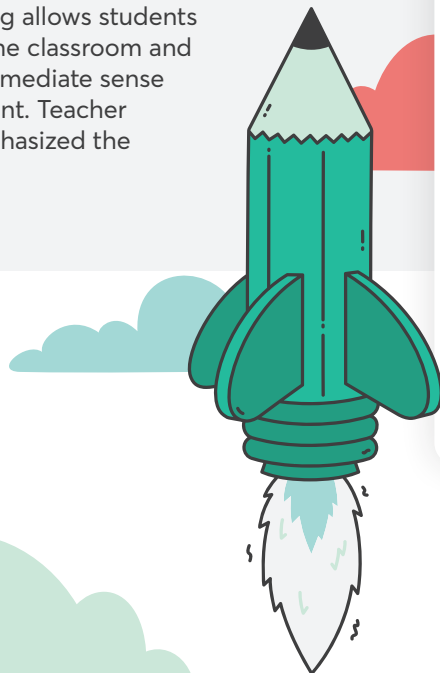
Thanks to support from the Desjardins Foundation Prizes, the project became a reality. The students learned to use tools to sand and paint their skateboards, but the initiative was really about motivation and self-esteem. Vice-Principal Noémie Tétreault said that many of these students have faced challenges, but "doing a project like this is a real source of pride."

Hands-on learning allows students to step outside the classroom and gives them an immediate sense of accomplishment. Teacher Carl Ouellet emphasized the

importance of concrete results: "They get an opportunity to develop skills. And realize they're able to build something from A to Z."

As Ms. Lapchuk-Dubé pointed out, the benefits of the project go way beyond the skateboards themselves. "Seeing a project like this through is more than just an achievement. Students start to feel that school really is this positive thing, and that's magical."

École Saint-David, Saguenay, QC "Getting to know a different side of my students was also a real learning experience for me."

In Saint-David-de-Falardeau, a small rural community in Saguenay–Lac-Saint-Jean, the local elementary school launched Tea Time, a heartwarming initiative that aims to break isolation and spark entrepreneurship. Students created a micro-business that produces tea bags in a variety of flavours.

From growing herbs to dehydrating fruit, designing packaging and calculating production costs, the students experienced every step in the process of bringing a product to market. But the real focus wasn't creating a business, it was bringing different generations of people together. The students gathered with older people in their community to sip tea, play board games and ultimately create meaningful bonds.

Teacher Marie-Ève Gaudreault noted the natural chemistry that emerged: "Our kids have old souls. They're fishers and hunters, so they naturally connect with older members of our community. The bonds form easily." The students acquired skills like cooperation and communication and strengthened their sense of belonging. "Getting to know a different side of my students was also a real learning experience for me. I'd love to do a project like this again," said Ms. Gaudreault.

"As the students moved ahead with the project, they developed even more respect for one another," said teacher Juliette Fontaine. She felt that the financial support provided by the Desjardins Foundation was crucial. "That support helped us make this wonderful project a reality. It would have been very difficult without the prize, because our community is under-resourced. It reminded me just how important educational initiatives and my role as a teacher really are," she said.

Supporting recognized expertise

We proudly support more than 20 organizations dedicated to academic perseverance, each one a leader in its field. These organizations take innovative approaches to helping young people reach their full potential and creating meaningful impacts in their communities.

Pathways to Education Using education to break the cycle of poverty

The Pathways to Education program helps students from under-resourced communities graduate from high school. David Leduc, director of philanthropy, explains that the organization's success is rooted in community involvement.

What is Pathways to Education's mission and what is it doing on the ground?

We believe that it's crucial for students from under-resourced communities to finish high school. Our model is delivered through a network of community organizations that are already established at the grassroots level. That allows us to understand local families and issues. Our program is built on four key pillars: academic support (tutoring), social support (adult role models), tailored one-on-one support and financial support to remove immediate barriers like the cost of transportation and school supplies. Each of our support workers develops tailored success plans for 35 to 50 students.

How long has Pathways to Education been helping students?

The program was founded nearly 25 years ago by Carolyn Acker in Regent Park, a low-income neighbourhood in Toronto, Ontario, to address a serious dropout problem. She created a pilot project that reduced dropout rates by 70% in five years. Our first foray into Quebec was in Verdun in 2007–2008. We've grown significantly since then. We're currently working with students in 13 of Quebec's 17 administrative regions, including our only on-reserve program in Mashteuiatsh.

What tangible results are you seeing?

The data is impressive, and it shows that our approach works. In Quebec, we've grown from 562 graduates in 2018–2019 to over 1,600 today. Those numbers reflect improved graduation rates as each cohort progresses through to the end of high school.

The needs are enormous. We want to expand to several new regions, but doing so will require strengthened support. That's why the help we're receiving from the Desjardins Foundation is so vital.

Auberges du cœur "They gave me a home."

Auberges du cœur is a vital network of shelters for young people experiencing homeless or precarious living situations in Quebec. These shelters don't just provide a place to sleep—they offer a secure and structured community environment.

"Fondation des Auberges du cœur's mission is to provide financial support to 32 different shelters across Quebec," said Sonia Langlois, executive director of the foundation. "Support from the Desjardins Foundation allows us to help young people who are returning to school or who want to continue their education. Since 2017, we've been able to assist over 3,000 young people." Fondation des Auberges du cœur provides support in many different forms, from tutoring to paying for school supplies and computers.

The impact on residents at the shelters is significant. For example, Cédric Fitzback was able to go back to school, and he speaks to the power of community at his shelter: "They gave me so much—listening, support, safety. Honestly, they gave me a home."

THE POWER OF OUR NETWORK

The caisses provide key support for academic perseverance

Our collaboration with the caisses and the exceptional support they provide allows Desjardins Group and the Desjardins Foundation to deliver on our commitment to youth. Here's a closer look at four regional initiatives that stood out this year and helped scholarship recipients pursue their ambitions.



Good laughs and positive vibes in Laval

All seven caisses in Laval joined forces to honour 110 scholarship recipients at a gala celebration to remember. The event was hosted by comedian Guillaume Pineault and it offered scholarship recipients and their loved ones an opportunity to celebrate in a festive atmosphere featuring an electrifying dance performance.



Inaugural regional meet-up in Montreal

This year we inaugurated "L'après 5 Desjardins," our first regional youth event on the Island of Montreal. The event was hosted by a group of 19 caisses, and it welcomed about 500 people to Complexe Desjardins, where scholarships were awarded to some 300 students.



An immersive experience at Quai 30 in Quebec City

The third edition of Terrasse Desjardins was hosted by 20 caisses from the Quebec City area and brought together 1,500 attendees at the Old Port for a very special event. This year alone, over \$1 million in scholarships were awarded to students in the region.

Gathering at the International Balloon Festival

This year, Caisse Desjardins du Haut-Richelieu, Caisse Desjardins des Moissons-et-de-Roussillon and Caisse Desjardins des Seigneuries de la frontière handed out \$229,500 in scholarships. To celebrate, they invited 140 students to the International Balloon Festival of Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu. Participants were invited to share their views on regional issues to make sure the cooperative's future projects align with their aspirations.

The Desjardins Foundation is supported by 151 Allies, who are appointed by the caisse boards. They act as ambassadors for the Foundation, both on their boards and in their communities. Their engagement is essential and deserves our heartfelt recognition.

RECOGNITION GALA

Celebrating the people who make dreams possible



Young people who are able to focus on their studies instead of juggling multiple jobs just to get by. Teachers who receive the funds they need to launch initiatives that ignite students' passion for school. Behind every donation to the Desjardins Foundation, there's a real domino effect: helping hands that have a concrete impact on hundreds of thousands of young people.

To celebrate these successes, some 200 people gathered on October 9, 2025, at the Desjardins Foundation's recognition gala. The goal was to spotlight the tangible impacts created by our donors, partners, volunteers and fundraiser organizers. "Thanks to you, these young people are able to believe in their dreams and have confidence in their future," said Nancy Lee, outgoing Executive Director of the Desjardins Foundation.

Education is one of the most powerful tools we have to give people hope, confidence and a sense that they are competent and useful, said Denis Dubois, President and CEO of Desjardins Group and member of the Foundation's board of directors.

Impacts beyond the classroom

It's important to remember the people behind the statistics and the lives that are being transformed. Over the course of the evening, a number of people shared testimonials about the impacts of Desjardins Foundation Prizes and scholarships.

Teacher Louis Laroche created a project that helps students make podcasts. "It gives them confidence. Thanks to this program, one of my students stood up and spoke in front of her entire class for the very first time," he said.

Another teacher, Lyne Joyal, said the Foundation's support had a positive impact not only on students, but also on her community. When she launched an urban gardening project with her students, she realized that "people got involved because it really made sense pedagogically. Our kids took responsibility for a little garden. It might be small for us, but it's huge for them!"



High-impact engagement from the extended Desjardins family

Employees across Desjardins truly rally together to support youth. Whether it's through fundraising campaigns or volunteer work, the extended Desjardins family raises money that's essential to helping students stay in school. Here are some inspiring initiatives whose scope and community spirit illustrate the strength of our collective efforts.

Desjardins Cares and Shares campaign: A new record!

Each year, Desjardins holds an internal fundraising campaign. It's a unique opportunity for employees, managers, board members and retired employees to **support the Foundation's work**.

And each year, the response is truly exceptional! **In 2025, the campaign raised over \$3.5 million**, up 9% over the previous year. The number of donors is also growing steadily: some 19,100 people contributed to the Foundation, up 1,000 from 2024. These are all-time record results for the campaign.

On the Road: A can't-miss event

Since it was launched in 2016 with a small group of relay runners racing all the way from Lévis to Montreal, **On the Road** has become a marquee event at Desjardins. It's a 24-hour charitable challenge led by the Procurement, Accounting and Administrative Services Division. More and more runners and walkers are taking part as the event continues to grow.



Renewed commitment to youth

The energy at the ninth edition was truly electric. Nearly **400 colleagues** ran and walked around the clock to support academic perseverance. Their collective effort set a new record, raising over **\$337,000**.

The generosity of participants and donors translates into direct and meaningful support. Since **On the Road** was launched, close to **53,000 young people** have benefited from the money it has raised.

Even more initiatives to benefit youth

- The sixth edition of philanthropic networking event **Huitres en affaires** brought together nearly 900 professionals at Complexe Desjardins. This year's edition raised a record **\$203,750**, which was shared between three organizations, including the Desjardins Foundation.
- The **Récüp** program, an initiative of Desjardins Group's Real Estate Services Division, gives office furniture and equipment a second life by offering them to non-profit organizations. Récüp invites beneficiary organizations to make a voluntary contribution to support the Desjardins Foundation's mission.
- Desjardins Business rallied together at a golf tournament organized as a tribute to **Mario Lapierre**, a manager, generous philanthropist and Bâtitseur Desjardins. Thanks to the participants' generosity, the event raised over \$36,000, which was shared between two organizations, including the Desjardins Foundation.

PHILANTHROPIC FUNDS

Giving with vision, today and tomorrow

Philanthropy is evolving. Today, Desjardins members and clients don't just want to make one-off donations to the causes they care about. They want to build a legacy, organize their generosity and maximize the impact of their contributions. This desire for optimization is the driving force behind the growing popularity of the Desjardins Foundation's philanthropic funds, which are celebrating their 10th anniversary this year.

A simple formula

Why so much interest in philanthropic funds? Because they offer a perfect balance between the flexibility of a private foundation and the simplicity of turnkey support. The Desjardins Foundation gives donors an agile structure, with support for the administrative, legal and operational management of their fund. Donors are able to focus their energy on what matters most: supporting the causes and organizations they care about.

We work closely with wealth management experts at Desjardins, so donors get exclusive access to a multidisciplinary team. This synergy allows donors to integrate philanthropy into their overall financial planning. It transforms an act of generosity into a well-planned, optimized donation strategy. Whether it's planned giving during their lifetime or a deferred gift, donors get comprehensive support to help them achieve their philanthropic goals as effectively as possible.

Donations that keep on giving

The process is as smooth as it is effective: the fund is established upon receipt of the first donation and the capital is invested to generate income. The fund can subsequently provide annual financial support to the registered charities recommended by the person who created it. A fund is also a project that can evolve according to the donor's wishes, meaning it can be modified along the way.

Once again this year, our donors have confirmed that philanthropy is alive and well at Desjardins. We're proud to support these visionaries, who are committed to building a more compassionate and united society.

"Ten years on, one thing still holds true: generosity inspires hope. Every fund, every donation and every project that receives support is a reminder that we can make a difference when we work together," said Nancy Lee, outgoing Executive Director of the Desjardins Foundation.

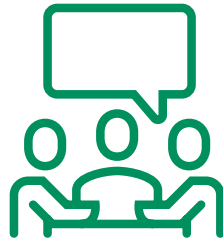


Success powered by an engaged community
