



AWARDS

PARTNERSHIPS

The Desjardins Foundation offers awards and scholarships in partnership with other organizations that have proven themselves in their respective fields.

Figure skater Charlie Bilodeau received a \$2,500 scholarship thanks to a partnership between the Desjardins Foundation and **Fondation Sport-Études**.

Last season was a milestone in the career of this skater, who, with partner Julianne Séguin, won the silver medal at the World Junior Championships, placed eighth in the senior World Championships, and came in first at the final Junior Grand Prix in Barcelona! This year, the pair plans to take on the seniors, where they'll try to make the Grand Prix finals. In the longer term, the pair is hoping to compete in the 2018 Olympic Games in Pyeongchang.

Charlie is currently studying corporate sociodigital communications at the Université du Québec à Montréal. He plans to work in communications after graduating.

Through a partnership with the **Fondation pour l'éducation à la coopération et à la mutualité**, the Desjardins Foundation created a

fund specifically to support cooperation promotion and education activities. In 2015, a \$33,626 donation was made to back initiatives such as cooperative learning training for new agents in schools and a workshop on leadership and entrepreneurship for secondary-level students.

THROUGH ITS PARTNERSHIPS, THE DESJARDINS FOUNDATION MADE A DIFFERENCE IN THE LIVES OF MORE THAN 6,000 PEOPLE IN 2015. A TOTAL OF \$662,000 WAS AWARDED IN PARTNERSHIP WITH ORGANIZATIONS ACTIVE IN COOPERATION, DEMOCRACY AND ACADEMIC RETENTION.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Selection committees received and reviewed more than 6,000 applications in 2015—nearly twice as many as last year—which is a sign that our students have significant financial needs. The committees selected 409 scholarship recipients from all levels of post-secondary education and all fields of study, awarding \$765,500 in total.

Jurors reviewed candidate applications based on financial need, community involvement, academic standing and the ability to overcome obstacles. These scholarships provided hundreds of young people with the help they needed to continue their education and the motivation to keep going until they got their degree.



I'm going back to school to acquire the tools I need to get a job in our region that's in line with my aspirations. [...] I love my classes and I'm always striving to do better. I get good grades because I only work during the summer season, not while I'm in school. That's why I'm looking for possible solutions to increase our family income. I speak of family income, because since June 2015, we are now three at home. The goal is really long-term financial stability for our little family.

SUPPORTING THE COMMITMENT OF INDIVIDUALS

Volunteer involvement in the community is a sign of a successful society. The Desjardins Foundation Prizes for Volunteer Involvement recognize volunteers who go above and beyond. In addition to acknowledging and encouraging volunteerism, a \$1,000 prize is awarded to a charity of the volunteer's choice.

My Dad would say, "You may not be able to change the world, but you can change yourself and improve the community around you if you pitch in." So from that experience I try to pitch in when and where I can.

My daughter began rowing four years ago with the Notre Dame Rowing Club in Welland. Her younger brother and sister soon joined the challenge. My children had found their passion and it was only right that I help out like my parents did for me. I could see that the rowing coaches were teaching kids to row, yes, but they were also teaching perseverance in the face of defeat and how to build a team and trust and support each other.



So, for a couple of hours every morning I fix shells and oars, paint, clean, and do what I can so coaches can concentrate on what's most important: the kids. What a sport, what a change I see in the kids. I am just a small part: I may be Mr. K. to them at regattas, but at the boathouse I work very closely with them, giving first aid, listening to their challenges and making their boats faster.

If you could start your day like this watching sunrises and angels spreading their wings on the water, I am sure you, too, would spend hundreds of hours supporting them. Because I see youth getting this kind of great experience, I am not worried—I am proud of them.

Together, we're making a difference in our community, making a difference in the lives of these young people, and creating hope for the future.

97 PRIZES WERE AWARDED THIS YEAR, WHICH MEANS A TOTAL OF \$97,000 WAS GIVEN TO ORGANIZATIONS IN QUEBEC AND ONTARIO.



I was born in the late 1960s, in a Quebec where homosexuality was still quite taboo. So, like so many gays, lesbians and bisexuals of my generation, I grew up with fear in my heart. Fear of being different. Fear of being mocked and despised. Fear of not being loved.

When I joined the ranks of GRIS-Montreal, I was no longer afraid. At 32, I wanted to give young people something that I did not have the chance to have at their age: an example, a positive model of a gay man who's comfortable with himself and happy in his love life as well as his professional life.

Throughout my 17 years of involvement—answering questions from students, training new volunteers to do the same and representing the group as President for almost a decade—I'm still just as motivated as ever to proudly portray a different image of this lifestyle that is still misunderstood. In that same spirit, I wrote a book last year for the 20th anniversary of GRIS, entitled Modèles recherchés – L'homosexualité et la bisexualité racontées autrement [Models Wanted – A Different Perspective of Homosexuality and Bisexuality].

Also, as long as my motivation is driven by the overwhelmingly positive reception of young people, I'll be happy to keep contributing to the society of tomorrow, alongside hundreds of other GRIS volunteers, by revealing ourselves as we are to foster dialogue, eliminate prejudice and make school open, respectful of differences and free from homophobia.

ALLÔ PROF

The Desjardins Foundation made a financial contribution of \$50,000 to Allô prof, a charitable organization that offers free homework assistance to all primary, secondary and adult education students, and to parents of students. In support of its mission, Allô prof provides eight services (phone, text and six online services) manned by a team of qualified instructors and a virtual community made up of student helpers, parents, and players in the field of education. Students have observed that these services help them study more effectively, complete assignments and, above all, learn more.

RETURNING TO SCHOOL

THE SQAF'S BERNARD-NORMAND AWARDS

In partnership with **Institut de coopération pour l'éducation aux adultes (ICEA)**, the Desjardins Foundation awards 34 scholarships of \$500: 17 to recognize the commitment and perseverance of adults in their training process, and 17 for adults who return to school.

"I DON'T GIVE UP, I'M A WINNER" LITERACY FOUNDATION BURSARIES

Five bursaries of \$1,000 each are offered annually to underscore the perseverance and determination of adults who have successfully undertaken literacy or basic training.

REDUCING SCHOOL DROPOUT RATES

MON ENFANT, SON AVENIR (MESA) GUIDES, VOLUMES 1 AND 2

These guides are for parents of children from grade five to the end of secondary school. They offer tools and resources to help them understand their child's academic path so they can better guide them along it. These guides were made possible through a partnership with **Partenaires pour la réussite éducative dans les Laurentides (PREL)**. Some 20,000 copies were distributed throughout the province. They are available free of charge on the Desjardins Foundation website.

to prepare my second career at Desjardins Group. Desjardins Foundation is giving me a scholarship this fall, which is a huge encouragement.



EDUCAID AND THE PERSÉVÉRA PROGRAM FOR HIGH-SCHOOLERS

The Desjardins Foundation is committed to sponsoring 130 students over a 3-year period for a total commitment of \$195,000. The purpose of this program is to help students from disadvantaged neighbourhoods stay in school by encouraging them to persevere. Sponsored students will receive a \$500 scholarship each year for their educational needs, and the money will be managed with the help of participating schools' administration.

I hope I get this scholarship to help me stay in school. I don't want to be like my brother, who doesn't go to school anymore, or like my mother. I want to be a chiropractor or veterinarian, or another job in health. I need clothing for gym class and school supplies. That way I'll be sure to not get punished because I don't have my things. I also need warm clothing because I walk to school. That would help motivate me to go every day. I really hope I get chosen.


The Desjardins Foundation awards five scholarships of \$1,250 each every year to secondary school students to encourage them to pursue their studies and recognize their community involvement.

ARTS-ÉTUDES PROGRAM

The Arts-Études program supports academic retention through visual art and music programs in schools. The Desjardins Foundation contributes by awarding \$8,000 in scholarships to young people who persevered in the program.

FUNDRAISING

Attendees of the 2012 Desjardins Group Annual General Meetings expressed a desire to see Desjardins Foundation become a source of pride for Desjardins Group. With a view to meeting this goal, the Foundation launched a major six-year fundraising campaign that solicited participation from throughout Desjardins Group and the general public.

CAISSE FUNDRAISING

312 caisses, or 93% of the network, participated in the fundraising campaign in 2015. A total of \$1,142,280 was collected through the caisses' collective effort to support their Foundation. Caisse donations are made on a voluntary basis, so the entire network acts in a spirit of intercooperation to increase the Foundation's capacity for action.

DESJARDINS COMPONENT AND FÉDÉRATION DES CAISSES DESJARDINS DU QUÉBEC (FEDERATION) FUNDRAISING

In 2015, the Desjardins Foundation received \$2 million from the Federation and \$1 million from the components. Most of these sums are capitalized to ensure the long-term viability of the Foundation.

PRECIOUS ALLIES FOR THE DESJARDINS FOUNDATION

CYCLOSPORTIVE DESJARDINS IN SAINT-HYACINTHE

A dynamic cycling event with David Veilleux, first Quebec cyclist to have completed the Tour de France. Participants gave a \$20 donation to Desjardins Foundation to ride in the event, which raised a total of \$3,800.

DÉFI SPORTIF DESJARDINS IN LÉVIS AND SAINT-JEAN-SUR-RICHELIEU

A health-focused event for Desjardins employees, officers and friends, along with their families. Participants meet walking, running or cycling challenges and got sponsored to raise funds for the cause of their choice, including \$5,855 for the Desjardins Foundation.



APVCG GOLF TOURNAMENT

The Association des présidents et vice-présidents des caisses de groupes Desjardins (APVCG) raised \$9,500 for the Desjardins Foundation at its annual golf tournament.

The Greater Montreal chapter of the Association des professionnels de la construction et de l'habitation du Québec (APCHQ) raised \$4,000 for the Desjardins Foundation at its annual golf tournament.

40-STOREY CLIMB

AccèsD Division colleagues dared each other to climb the 40 floors of the Complexe Desjardins south tower to benefit the Foundation. They rose to the challenge and raised \$1,340.



SOIRÉE DES GRANDS VINS DU MONDE

Greater Montreal caisses and a number of partners participated in the Soirée des Grands vins du Monde, with Richard Béliveau and Guy Cormier as honorary chairpersons. The event raised \$22,828 for the Desjardins Foundation.

Desjardins Group's suppliers attended a networking dinner in the company of Monique F. Leroux and the senior vice-presidents of Desjardins Group. The event raised \$27,100.

Monique F. Leroux and Les Voix de Desjardins, a choir made up of Desjardins employees and officers, gave a lunch hour Christmas concert at the Complexe Desjardins Grande Place. Audience members were invited to make a donation to the Desjardins Foundation. A total of \$1,526 was collected.

DESJARDINS ENDOWMENT FUNDS

The Desjardins Foundation continued marketing turnkey solutions tailored to the needs of major donors with its Desjardins Endowment Funds.

These funds meet several needs of Desjardins members and clients:

- Maintain a long-term commitment with an organization
- Simplify administrative procedures
- Reduce their tax burden
- Leave a philanthropic legacy without penalizing heirs

DESJARDINS ENDOWMENT FUNDS CAN BE PERSONALIZED OR SECTOR-BASED.

Sector-based endowments funds allow donors to support one or more philanthropic sectors chosen among five areas that are essential to the society of today and tomorrow. Giving to a sector-based endowment fund means contributing to a collective effort for a lasting and positive impact on society.

Culture:

Support cultural organizations that participate in the development of Quebec culture in society.

Sustainability:

Maintain environmental integrity, social equity and economic efficiency to create an environmentally and socially responsible society.

Education:

Make education a catalyst for sustainable prosperity by supporting students through every stage of their education until graduation (from primary to adult education).

Humanitarian:

Further the social and economic autonomy of individuals.

Health and healthy lifestyles:

Research and promote healthy lifestyles.

I've been offering financial support to a small organization in my community for 20 years. When I die, the organization may have to close if it no longer has my support. That's why I decided to set up a Desjardins Endowment Fund with a life insurance policy that allows me to benefit from tax breaks for donations when I pay the premiums. When I die, the Desjardins Foundation will use the capital to create my endowment fund with proceeds going to the organization I want to support.

With **personalized endowment funds**, donors can support the causes and organizations of their choice, in perpetuity or for a given time period. It's a simple, concrete solution that can take the place of a private foundation.

Donors can create endowment funds through a living donation or gift by will.

MEMBERS OF CAISSE DU COMPLEXE DESJARDINS POOL THEIR DIVIDENDS

At their 2015 annual general meeting, members of Caisse du Complexe Desjardins voted in favour of collective rather than individual member dividends. They used the \$250,000 earmarked for member dividends to create an endowment fund for the Herstreet organization. The annual investment income of their fund will be paid in perpetuity to this organization that helps Montreal homeless women.
