

Desjardins Foundation awards funds to 72 inspiring youth initiatives in Ontario, Alberta and New-Brunswick



Ottawa, March 20, 2023 – The Desjardins Foundation recently announced it will award \$200,000 to 72 youth-focused projects across Ontario, Alberta and New Brunswick as part of its Desjardins Foundation Prizes.

Available to both school and community workers, the program provides financial assistance up to \$3,000 for small projects that have a direct impact on elementary and secondary school students. These dedicated professionals know better than anyone how to engage and inspire youth, but often lack the needed resources to make it happen. The prize funds help turn their ideas into reality, and this year over 33,000 kids will benefit directly from these amazing projects.

Some of the awarded projects include:

- A mental wellness program by the Newmarket African Caribbean Canadian Association to support the Black youth community in York region by providing free sessions of culturally relevant mental health education and support.
- The Gaia Project Sustainability Literacy Kits which provides elementary school classes in Fredericton with a curated selection of age-appropriate books relating to the environment.
- Lethbridge Collegiate Institute's Fitness Youth Inclusion Program which provides appropriate equipment for students with physical, mental or language barriers to promote healthy active lifestyles.

"Our youth play an important role in shaping our future and Desjardins is committed to helping young people achieve their dreams through projects that motivate them to work hard and stay in school," said Billy Boucher, CEO of Desjardins Ontario Credit Union. "Teachers and community



workers are on the frontlines with youth and see firsthand the needs and learning opportunities that show up in the everyday moments. We are extremely proud to support those who go above and beyond to provide young people with positive opportunities.”

The Desjardins Foundation Prizes have been supporting projects across Ontario for more than 7 years and recently expanded the program to Alberta and New Brunswick in 2020. In total it has helped support 68,000 students and awarded more than \$521,000 to 185 projects in these regions.
