Two local students receive scholarships for academic perseverance

MONTREAL (QUÉBEC), January 21th, 2019 – On January 21th, Centre-est de Montréal and Educaide, a nonprofit organization that provides financial assistance to students, awarded \$500 scholarships to two students at John F. Kennedy High School. The money empowers students to persevere and get their high school diploma.

Since 2002, Educaide has been giving scholarships to underprivileged students to encourage them to stay in school. The organization awards \$500 to students in secondary 3. Recipients who demonstrate the will and determination to complete their high school studies can have their scholarship renewed every year until they receive their diploma. This scholarship program is made possible today by Educaide's partnership with the Desjardins Foundation. "We want to provide equal opportunity to as many students as possible so they can pursue their studies and

reach their full potential,” said Tina Fournier Ouellet, General Manager of Educaide. “We sometimes overlook the challenges some of these teens are facing. This can be the financial boost that helps them reach new heights and achieve the life they want,” she adds. “This scholarship can make all the difference to these students. If we encourage them to persevere, it may very well be the push they need. If we show a student who’s struggling that we believe in them, they will start to believe in themselves,” said Nancy Lee, Manager of the Desjardins Foundation.
